INTRODUCTION

"IT'S FRAGILE AND SWEET, THIS MOMENT, LIKE FLAKES OF SUGAR DISINTEGRATING ON YOUR TONGUE WHEN YOU'VE BARELY HAD TIME TO TASTE."

Reel follows a renowned director, Canon Holt, who stumbles upon the "lost" story of Dessi Blue, a blues/jazz singer from the 1930s who, like so many artists of color, never received the recognition or celebration she deserved. He casts a relatively unknown actress, Neevah Saint, to star in the large-scale biopic. Not only do Canon and Neevah discover the epic journey of Dessi, a fictionalized composite of performers like Bessie Smith, Ma Rainey, Billie Holiday, and Adelaide Hall, but they navigate love and explore acceptance while negotiating the pitfalls of the Hollywood spotlight.

AUTHOR INTERVIEW

What inspired you to write about both the Harlem Renaissance and the current Hollywood Renaissance?

Reel is a love letter to creatives of color who brought us so much joy and high art under sometimes awful circumstances living in a country that saw their skin before their gift. I drew from the energy fueling projects like The United States v. Billie Holiday on Hulu, Ma Rainey's Black Bottom on Netflix and Sylvie's Love and One Night In Miami on Amazon. There is a burst of creativity and production among creatives of color we haven't seen at this level maybe since the Harlem Renaissance. It is accompanied by newfound creative agency and power, enabling us to tell our stories unfiltered, through our lens and with our voices. I see this story as a slice of what is happening in broader culture, and I'm excited to add my perspective through romance storytelling. I want to shine light on this movement and what it means, not just for communities of color, but for everyone.

You weaved the story of Dessi Blue into Neevah and Canon's story. Was it difficult to craft this style of story within a story?

I had never written a screenplay. I actually bought a copy of the script from The Cotton Club to see the format for a movie in the period in which I was writing. The most challenging parts were figuring out how much of Dessi's story to reveal before that thread would start to distract from the primary love story. And then how to fit that into the natural flow of the story. Meaning, in a way that organically intersected with the action occurring in the contemporary storyline. It was surgical and I adjusted both storylines as I went along to ensure that flow.

What can we expect in future books in the series?

Takira's story, The Close-Up, a novella, releases September 14, 2021. Monk and Verity will get a full-length novel early 2022 and Evan's story a little later. There may be one more novella in the series somewhere, but we'll have to see!

- 1. Kennedy Ryan crafted a unique structure for this book. How did you feel about the intertwining of the novel and the movie script? Past and present? How did this enhance or detract from the reading/listening experience?
- 2. What did you like most about the book? What did you like the least?
- 3. Were there any quotes (or passages) that stood out to you? Why?
- 4. Which character or moment prompted the strongest emotional reaction for you? Why?
- 5. Were there times you disagreed with Canon's or Neevah's actions? What would you have done differently?
- 6. Were there any plot twists that you loved? Disliked?
- 7. Neevah and her sister, Terry, have a complicated relationship. How did you feel about its evolution throughout the book?
- 8. Canon aims to amplify Black voices with his work. Take some time to have a look at real historical figures whose achievements have been miscredited or overlooked in the past (website)
- 9. What specific themes does Kennedy Ryan explore throughout this novel?
- 10. How does Neevah Saint grow and change throughout the story? How is her personality and confidence impacted as the story evolves?
- 11. In what ways does this book hold a mirror to societal issues?
- 12. If you were to ask Kennedy Ryan a question about the book, what would it be?
- 13. Even though this book is classified as fiction, there is a lot that is grounded in reality. Did anything surprise you?

APPLE COBBLER

FILLING:

6 MEDIUM TART BAKING APPLES (GRANNY SMITH, HONEY CRISP, GALA, ETC.), PEELED AND SLICED

1/2 C BROWN SUGAR

2 TSP CORNSTARCH

1 LEMON

1/2 TSP VANILLA EXTRACT

1 TSP CINNAMON

1 TSP GROUND NUTMEG

PINCH OF SALT

TOPPING:

1 C FLOUR
2 TSP BAKING POWDER
1/4 TSP SALT
1/2 C SUGAR
3/4 C MILK
6 TBSP MELTED BUTTER
2 TSP VANILLA EXTRACT

PREHEAT OVEN TO 350 DEGREES, GREASE 9X13 BAKING DISH AND SET ASIDE.

IN MIXING BOWL (LARGE), COMBINE APPLES, BROWN SUGAR, CORNSTARCH, JUICE FROM THE LEMON, VANILLA EXTRACT, CINNAMON, NUTMEG AND SALT. TOSS TOGETHER AND POUR INTO BAKING DISH.

IN MIXING BOWL (MEDIUM), WHISK DRY INGREDIENTS TOGETHER - FLOUR, BAKING POWDER, SALT AND SUGAR TOGETHER. ADD WET INGREDIENTS - MILK, MELTED BUTTER AND VANILLA EXTRACT. WHISK TO COMBINE AND POUR OVER THE FILLING.

BAKE FOR 40-45 MINUTES UNTIL CRUST IS GOLDEN BROWN. SERVE WARM.

CUCUMBER & TEA FACE MASK

Steep cup of black tea for five minutes. Add 1 tbsp. honey. Stir until dissolved. Add cucumber slices and soak for ten minutes. Place cucumber slices on face. Let sit for ten to twenty minutes. Remove and rinse face with warm water.




WHIPPED BODY BUTTER

Melt 3/4 c cocoa butter and 1/4 c coconut oil in a double boiler. Place in freezer for 20 minutes until it solidifies again. Add to stand mixer bowl or use electric beater to blend for five minutes until fluffy. Store in clean container.
